SPANIEL CLUB LAUNCHES ONLINE BREED HEALTH SURVEY

The American Spaniel Club Foundation, together with the American SpanielClub, launched the Cocker Spaniel-Comprehensive Breed Health Survey today.

Using the current technologies, the survey is primarily designed to be completed online at http://www.asc-cockerspaniel.org/survey/index. html but can also be downloaded, printed and mailed to the project's contracted data manager, Larry Hopkins.

Cocker fanciers, breeders and pet owners throughout the world are encouraged to participate. This is an inclusive effort to try and capture the current health status of Cockers today. Members of the American Spaniel Club will receive a letter this week from the data firm, with a unique personal identification number (PIN) to use when entering their animals.

Non members will create their own PIN and will need to use it in order to update and add their dogs' information.

Instructions on both what dogs to include and the technical parts of the data entry are provided online.

THIS IS A CONFIDENTIAL SURVEY AND ALL DATA IS MANAGED BY ELEMENTS SOFTWARE ENGINEERING. The online database and form were designed and developed by Matt Orkins. The ASCF-Scientific Research Committee workgroup for this project includes: Wilma Parker, Elaine Mathis, Jane Williams, Jean Delisle, Shelia Leveritt, Sandra Bell, Bill Mixon, Jolene O'Brion, Heidi Braun, Shirley Hunsaker, Jeanne Grim, DVM, and Bobbie Kolehouse under the direction of the Scientific Research Committee chair, Doug McFarlane.

The content for the survey was developed by the workgroup with the help of the project veterinary epidemiology researcher and professor, Dr. Chet Thomas, DVM and approved by the ASCF Board of Directors.

The CS-CBHS is a dynamic project and will continue to be developed and refined to provide Cocker fanciers with information and resources to help assure the best future for Cocker Spaniels.
