Communicable Diseases:

Canine To Human

CAUSATIVE ORGANISM	ILLNESS OR SYMPTOMS	HOW SPREAD
Viruses Lyssavirus	Rabies	Bites or saliva from infected animal
Bacteria Campylobacter species	Gastroenteritis, campylobacteriosis (fever, malaise, abdominal cramps, diarrhea, bloody stools)	Usually from feces contaminating food; can be from contact with animal carrying bacterium
Leptospira species	Weill's disease (symptoms include muscular pain, fever and enlargement of liver and spleen accompanied by jaundice)	Direct or environmental contact with infected tissue or secretions (urine); environmental contamination
Salmonella species	Gastroenteritis (abdominal cramps, nausea, diarrhea, fever)	Contaminated food or contact with animal carrying the bacterium
Staphylococcus species	Various infections, including food poisoning, skin infections, osteomyelitis (infection of the bone), septic arthritis, bacterial pneumonia	Ingestion of contaminated food; contact with contaminated secretions or body fluids
Protozoa Leishmania species	Zoonotic visceral leishmaniasis (may cause ulcerations of the skin, nasal cavities, pharynx and internal organs) ¹	Contact with infected dogs
Worms—Helminths Ancylostoma (hookworm)	Cutaneous larval migrans (lesions caused by the larvae migrating beneath the skin)	Infective larvae enter through skin
Toxocara canis (roundworm)	Visceral larval migrans (may cause liver enlargement, blood cell abnormalities and fever); ocular larval migrans, where the worm travels within the eye	Ingestion of eggs from dog feces
